Year 2	<ul> <li>Rhythm is the pattern of sound</li> <li>You can evaluate and discuss a performance</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Songs have different themes.</li> <li>There are tuned and un-tuned percussion instruments.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Songs tell a story or describe an idea</li> <li>Rhythm is different to pulse</li> </ul>
Year 3	<ul> <li>There are different notes on tuned instruments that make different sounds.</li> <li>Improvisation is making up a tune that can be different every time</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Lyrics are the words in a song</li> <li>A song is made up of different instruments and vocalists</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Composition is a song that is written down and recorded</li> <li>A choir is singing in unison following a leader</li> </ul>
Year 4	<ul> <li>The mouthpiece of a recorder is what you blow through to make a sound</li> <li>There are different parts of a recorder that you assemble together.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>A good playing posture is sitting up and holding the recorder out in front of you.</li> <li>A melody is a sequence of notes to make a tune.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>A composer of a song is the person who wrote the music</li> <li>The different sections of a song include the introduction, the verse and chorus</li> </ul>
Year 5	<ul> <li>The musical dimensions of a song are: the texture, rhythm, pitch, dynamics and tempo.</li> <li>Songs have historical contexts</li> <li>Songs have style indicators that help us identify the style of music</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Motown is a style of music and has particular musical characteristics.</li> <li>The different sections of a song include the introduction, verses, chorus, bridge and instrumental</li> <li>A rhythm section of a band provides the underlying pulse.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>An instrumental part must be played in time when performing with others</li> <li>Music is written in the form of notation.</li> <li>A composition is when music is written and followed whereas improvisation can be changed as it is performed</li> </ul>
Year 6	<ul> <li>You can have strong feelings about different songs and particular styles of songs, liking or disliking a piece of music.</li> <li>You can express yourself in your music.</li> <li>Appraising a song is about how it makes you feel.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Carole King is a singer and composer.</li> <li>Other people sang Carole King's songs.</li> <li>Syncopation is when the rhythmic pattern occurs on the weak beats (off-beat)</li> <li>Harmony is when more than one person sings different notes at the same time</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Singers and vocalists have different styles of voice</li> <li>A musical artist is expressing themselves in their music</li> <li>Evaluating music includes describing what you like and dislike, where the music came from and how it was produced.</li> </ul>
