Year 2		The Bible is the Holy Book for Christians. It is divided into two parts - Old Testament and New Testament.  The festival of Easter remembers the last days of Jesus' life. Stories from the Bible give details about the last eight days of Jesus' life.  Jesus died so people can be forgiven and rose from the dead giving hope of a new life and this is remembered through the Easter story at Easter	<ul> <li>Jesus had 12 special friends called disciples. He chose special people to learn from him and carry on his work.</li> <li>Jesus showed people love and forgiveness. Some stories from the Bible show agape love – Zacchaeus – the story of forgiveness, the selfish farmer.</li> <li>The Lord's Prayer is about forgiveness. Christians believe that prayer is talking to God. By talking and listening to God, they can grow closer to him.</li> </ul>	•	The Qur'an (Muslim holy book) was revealed to Muhammad on the Night of Power. Muhammad is the final prophet. Ramadan celebrates when Muhammad received the first revelations from the Qur'an. It is an important festival for Muslims and lasts for a month and Muslims fast during daylight hours. Muslims pray five times a day and recite the Qur'an. They face Mecca.				
KS1	Humanism  A Humanist is a person who follows Humanism. It is a non-religious world view.  Humanists believe people only have one life. They focus on living the best life they can and how life can be improved for all.  Humanists do not believe in a god or deity or an after-life. They can be atheists. This means they do not believe in a god.  The 'happy human' is a symbol of Humanism.

Year 5	<ul> <li>The Christmas story is found in two Gospels; Matthew 1-2 and Luke 1-2. The two accounts are told from different viewpoints (Mary and Joseph).</li> <li>Christians pray because they believe that Jesus is with them to listen and to help. Prayer is an act that seeks to activate a rapport with an object of worship through deliberate communication.</li> <li>Christians believe that God is love and it matters what people do. Jesus is God with us. God is compassionate, all knowing, everywhere at once, all powerful, pure, set apart.</li> </ul>			<ul> <li>The practise of Zakat (giving) and Saum (fasting) show the concept of Khalifah. Khalifah is the role of looking after humans and all things Allah created.</li> <li>Recall and understand the importance of the story Bilal for Muslims. People are not judged by their position but by their commitment to obey Allah's commands. He was the first muezzin (prayer caller.)</li> <li>Muhammad is the final prophet and that others came before him. Adam, Abraham, Moses and Jesus came before.</li> <li>The meaning of the words Islam and Muslim. Islam means submission to the will of Allah and Muslim means someone who has willingly submitted themselves.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Abraham is the founding father of the covenant. When the soul breaks out of reincarnation it joins with Brahman      Holi is an important festival for Hindus and is the celebration of Spring and new life. It signifies good over evil and is a day of spreading happiness and love.

- Some Humanists are agnostics. This means they do not know whether a god or anything exists beyond the material world
- **Humanists use science, reason and logic to explain the world around them.** Humanists believe there is no grand purpose to life and that humans have the ability to give their lives meaning and make themselves and those around them happy.
- Humanists focus their attention on achieving the best they can in life. Death is the finality of life. There is no after-life. People will only live on through their children and memories other people have of their life
- Humanists might celebrate life events such as a wedding, a birth or a death. These do not contain any religious aspect.
