# **Behaviour Policy – Governors Statement of Principles**

The policy should take full account of, and reflect, the rights and responsibilities of the school, its children, and its parents/carers.

### **Our Core Principles:**

- Promote and support appropriate communications between the school, its children and parents/carers on the behaviour of individual children
- Treat all members of our school community with respect and dignity.
- Be so worded that they can be explained clearly to children of any age and level of attainment
- Enhance the safety and welfare of children and staff, and their perceptions of safety
- Make clear the links between the quality of the children's learning and acceptable behaviour. Promoting and improving teaching and learning and the children's enjoyment of school will encourage and support good behaviour
- Encourage a healthy balance between, and a positive attitude towards, competition, success, rewards and sanctions, to encourage good behaviour
- Promote consistency of application and support with continuing professional development for all staff
- Be challenging, but realistic and appropriate, in supporting the school's development plan, as the school builds on its successes
- Be transparent and well-focussed on inclusion, equality of application and match to each child's needs, in the context of social background, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation and disability
- Ensure that vulnerable children such as those with special educational needs, physical or mental health needs, migrant and refugee children, and looked-after children – receive sensitive and well-matched behavioural support matched to their needs.

### Application:

- These principles apply to behaviour within school, online, and during off-site activities.
- The headteacher is responsible for developing and reviewing the school's behaviour policy, guided by these principles.
