	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Birthdays are a special time.</b> Celebrations often include presents, food and people.</li><li>• <b>Christmas is a special time for Christians.</b> It is the story of the birth of Jesus.</li><li>• <b>A church is a Christian place of worship.</b></li><li>• <b>Easter is the most important time of year for a Christian.</b> It is the story of Jesus’ death.</li><li>• <b>Christians listen to special stories.</b> These are stories about Jesus.</li></ul>					
Year 1	Incarnation	Salvation	Agape	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Muslims follow the religion Islam; Allah created the universe.</b> It is a world religion. Humans need to look after the world.</li><li>• <b>Muhammad is a messenger sent from Allah.</b> He was sent to teach the teachings of Allah.</li><li>• <b>The five pillars of Islam show the will of Allah.</b> They help a Muslim to worship Allah and guide his daily life. They are faith, prayer, giving, fasting, pilgrimage.</li></ul>		
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Jesus is the son of God.</b> Jesus is kind, caring and forgiving. Jesus means ‘God saves’.</li><li>• <b>Advent is the time before Christmas, Christmas is the festival of Jesus’ birth.</b> It is an important festival for Christians.</li><li>• <b>Jesus was baptised</b> (welcomed into Christianity.) Trinity is the unity of the three parts of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>God is the creator of the universe.</b> They must respect and look after what He has made for them. Retell the six days of creation story.</li><li>• <b>Harvest says thank you to God for what He has provided.</b> God created the world that Christians live in and humans need to care for the world.</li><li>• <b>Christians talk to God through prayer and worship.</b> Adoration, confession and thanksgiving are different types of prayer.</li></ul>				
Year 2		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The Bible is the Holy Book for Christians.</b> It is divided into two parts - Old Testament and New Testament.</li><li>• <b>The festival of Easter remembers the last days of Jesus’ life.</b> Stories from the Bible give details about the last eight days of Jesus’ life.</li><li>• <b>Jesus died so people can be forgiven and rose from the dead</b> giving hope of a new life and this is remembered through the Easter story at Easter</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Jesus had 12 special friends called disciples.</b> He chose special people to learn from him and carry on his work.</li><li>• <b>Jesus showed people love and forgiveness.</b> Some stories from the Bible show agape love – Zacchaeus – the story of forgiveness, the selfish farmer.</li><li>• <b>The Lord’s Prayer is about forgiveness.</b> Christians believe that prayer is talking to God. By talking and listening to God, they can grow closer to him.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The Qur’an (Muslim holy book) was revealed to Muhammad on the Night of Power.</b> Muhammad is the final prophet.</li><li>• <b>Ramadan celebrates when Muhammad received the first revelations from the Qur’an.</b> It is an important festival for Muslims and lasts for a month. Muslims fast during daylight hours.</li><li>• <b>Muslims pray five times a day and recite the Qur’an.</b> They face Mecca.</li></ul>		
KS1	<b>Humanism</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>A Humanist is a person who follows Humanism.</b> It is a non-religious world view.</li><li>• <b>Humanists believe people only have one life.</b> They focus on living the best life they can and how life can be improved for all.</li><li>• <b>Humanists do not believe in a god or deity or an after-life. They can be atheists.</b> This means they do not believe in a god.</li><li>• <b>The ‘happy human’ is a symbol of Humanism.</b></li></ul>					
Year 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Baptism welcomes a person into the Christian church.</b> There is infant baptism (a baby) and believer’s baptism. Both use water.</li><li>• <b>Jesus teaches Christians to believe in one God: The Father.</b> Christians are the sheep; God is the shepherd.</li><li>• <b>Jesus is the son of God and able to perform miracles as the human incarnation of God.</b> The Bible retells the miracles Jesus performed.</li></ul>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Muslims pray five times a day as one way they submit to Allah.</b> It helps remind them what is important. Daily prayer is called Salat and they use a prayer mat and face Mecca.</li><li>• <b>Shahadah is the declaration of faith,</b> which contains the Muslim creed, the Kalimah.</li><li>• <b>angel Gabriel was sent down with God’s holy book, the Qur’an is a copy of this book and is treated with great respect.</b> God’s message is known as the ‘Straight Path’ or the Shariah.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>God first made his covenant agreement with Abraham.</b> The covenant is a special relationship Jewish people have with God.</li><li>• <b>Moses received the 10 commandments from God.</b> He received these on Mount Sinai and are the rules which Jews have to live by.</li><li>• <b>Passover is an eight-day festival.</b> It remembers the exodus of Jews from Egypt and their freedom from slavery.</li></ul>

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The salvation story tells how God saved humanity.</b> God created a perfect world, humanity went wrong, to save humanity God had a salvation plan, God came as Jesus to save humanity</li><li>• <b>Easter is an important festival for Christians and is the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus.</b> Christians believe that because Jesus died on the cross, they can be forgiven by God.</li><li>• <b>Forgiveness is important to Christians.</b> Christians forgive the sins of others like God forgives their sins.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Agape is unconditional love</b> like God has for all of humanity. It is selfless and unconditional.</li><li>• <b>Christians are taught to show love and kindness to everyone.</b> Bible stories show this: The Good Samaritan, The Widow’s Gift,</li><li>• <b>Christians offer help and support to their local communities.</b> Local churches in Yeovil such as The Lord’s Larder support people in need. Christian Aid week.</li></ul>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Brahman is the name of god for Hindus.</b> He has many different forms or deities and Hindus can choose which gods/goddesses to worship.</li><li>• <b>Diwali is an important festival for Hindus and is the celebration of light.</b> It represents good over evil and light over darkness. Hindus learn the story of Rama and Sita.</li><li>• <b>Hindus visit the mandir (temple) to worship and</b> have a special place for puja (worship) <b>at home.</b></li></ul>
	Year 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The Christmas story is found in two Gospels;</b> Matthew 1-2 and Luke 1-2. The two accounts are told from different viewpoints (Mary and Joseph).</li><li>• <b>Christians pray because they believe that Jesus is with them to listen and to help.</b> Prayer is an act that seeks to activate a rapport with an object of worship through deliberate communication.</li><li>• <b>Christians believe that God is love and it matters what people do.</b> Jesus is God with us. God is compassionate, all knowing, everywhere at once, all powerful, pure, set apart.</li></ul>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The practice of Zakat (giving) and Saum (fasting) show the concept of Khalifah.</b> Khalifah is the role of looking after humans and all things Allah created.</li><li>• <b>Recall and understand the importance of the story Bilal for Muslims.</b> People are not judged by their position but by their commitment to obey Allah’s commands. He was the first muezzin (prayer caller.)</li><li>• <b>Muhammad is the final prophet and others came before him.</b> Adam, Abraham, Moses and Jesus came before.</li><li>• <b>The meaning of the words Islam and Muslim.</b> Islam means submission to the will of Allah and Muslim means someone who has willingly submitted themselves.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Abraham is the founding father of the covenant.</b> This is the special relationship between the Jewish people and God.</li><li>• <b>Jews coming of age ceremonies – bar and bat mitzvah.</b> They happen around the age of 13 and children have to do a lot of preparation.</li><li>• <b>Shabbat is the Jewish day of rest.</b> It happens from sunset Friday to sunset Saturday. They remember the story of creation. God created the world in 6 days and rested on the 7<sup>th</sup>.</li><li>• <b>Jewish scripture is called the Tanakh, the Torah is most important.</b> There are three sections: Torah, Nev’ism and Ketuvim.</li></ul>	
	Year 6		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Atonement in Christianity refers to forgiving sin through the death and resurrection of Jesus.</b> Jesus is the Saviour of the world and through his death the sins of humanity are forgiven.</li><li>• <b>Easter celebrates Jesus dying to pay the debt of humanity’s sins.</b> Christians can be forgiven by God and have a relationship with Him, faith in Jesus gives eternal life.</li><li>• <b>There are different baptisms but all are a symbolic way of joining the church for Christians.</b> Water is used as a symbol of washing away sin and starting a new life.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>The Beatitudes are part of the Sermon on the Mount</b> where Jesus spoke to his people on a mountain about the way to live.</li><li>• <b>The meaning of revenge and reconciliation.</b> Revenge means paying someone back for a wrong they have done you; reconciliation means bringing people back together who have been separated by a wrong of some sort.</li><li>• <b>How the Christian church shows the love of God to both its members and the rest of society.</b> People should treat each other how they wish to be treated. Agape is a Greek work.</li></ul>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Hinduism is a pluralistic religion</b> which offers a vast variety of concepts of god. There is one supreme being – Brahman who exists in everything.</li><li>• <b>Hindus believe in reincarnation.</b> This is the belief that when the body dies their atman (soul) may move onto another being. When the soul breaks out of reincarnation it joins with Brahman.</li><li>• <b>Holi is an important festival</b> for Hindus and is the celebration of Spring and new life. It signifies good over evil and is a day of spreading happiness and love.</li></ul>	
KS2	Humanism	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Some Humanists are agnostics.</b> This means they do not know whether a god or anything exists beyond the material world</li><li>• <b>Humanists use science, reason and logic to explain the world around them.</b> Humanists believe there is no grand purpose to life and that humans have the ability to give their lives meaning and make themselves and those around them happy.</li><li>• <b>Humanists focus their attention on achieving the best they can in life. Death is the finality of life.</b> There is no after-life. People will only live on through their children and memories other people have of their life</li><li>• <b>Humanists might celebrate life events such as a wedding, a birth or a death.</b> These do not contain any religious aspect.</li><li>• <b>Name two prominent Humanist scientists of the modern period (Marie Curie, Albert Einstein, Helen Caldicott.)</b> Explain their contribution to the understanding of our world.</li><li>• <b>Humanists UK is an organisation</b> promoting understanding of Humanism. It uses the ‘happy human’ symbol.</li></ul>
